# COOL CRAFT: TEALIGHT SNOWMAN

This friendly snowman really lights up a room... or just a table or desk!



## What you'll need:

- White battery-operated tealight
- Permanent black marker
- Ribbon
- Black felt or cardboard
- Glue

## Instructions:

1. Draw eyes and a mouth on the tealight.
2. Cut a piece of ribbon to go around the side of the tealight.
3. Glue the ribbon to the side.
4. Cut out a hat shape from the felt or cardboard. Make sure it isn't too floppy!
5. Glue the hat to the top of the snowman's head.
6. When the glue is dry, flip the switch on the bottom of the snowman.
