### **ITEMS NEEDED**

- Variety of coins (pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters)
- 2 dice
- Sheet of paper with columns for each coin name (see picture)

### **HOW TO PLAY**

Players take turns rolling the dice. The number they roll is how many pennies they will draw for their turn. As each player gets more coins, they will exchange for larger coins. The first player who reaches a total of \$1.00 wins!



### **CUPCAKE COINS**

Practice your coin counting skills with this fun and interactive game!

### **ITEMS NEEDED**

- Cupcake liners
- 1 Pompom
- Variety of coins (pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters)



### **HOW TO PLAY**

- Have an adult mark the amount of change on the cupcake liners.
   Try this: Pick amounts that use more than one coin!
- 2. Place them randomly on the table.
- 3. Sit in front of the liners and get ready to toss the pompom!
- 4. Aim and toss the pompom into one of the liners. When the pompom lands into a liner, gather your coins and put that amount into the cupcake liner. Check with an adult to see if the amount is correct.

Challenge: Use as few coins as possible to get to the correct amount!
